

OPERATION BEAT CHATTANOOGA ORDER 1-2A

- 1. Situation.** The Citadel has its third 2016 season football game on 15 October against Chattanooga.
- 2. Mission.** The SCCC executes a pep rally on 13 Oct from 1730 to 1940 in the Summerall Field/Padgett-Thomas Barracks area in order to support the team, display school spirit, and have fun.
- 3. Execution.**
 - A. *Commander's Intent.* The desired end state is victory on Saturday. In order to achieve that end state the SCCC must show its support for the football team and its esprit de corps as a unit. The football team must show its appreciation of the SCCC and express the value it places on SCCC support.
 - B. *Concept of Operations.* The concept is to create a fast-moving sequence of events in the Summerall Field/P-T Barracks area in which cadets can eat, socialize, be entertained, and show spirit in a variety of ways. See Annex A, Operations Overlay
 - 1) Phase I is set up and movement and runs from 1200-1730.
 - 2) Phase II is chow service and runs from 1730-1815.
 - 3) Phase III is performances and runs from 1815 to 1920.
 - 4) Phase IV is activities and runs from 1920 to 1935.
 - 5) Phase V is the conclusion and runs from 1935 to 1940. [See Annex B, Timeline](#)
 - C. *Scheme of Maneuver.*
 - 1) Phase I, the band will play in the mess hall during lunch, and Coach Thompson will address the cadets during the announcement period. The Regimental Activities Officer will also explain the pep rally concept.
 - a) Throughout the afternoon the Office of Cadet Activities, Aramark, the Cadet Activities chain of command, and the Cadet Supply chain of command will ensure the chow line, and entertainment items is set up. The DJ will set up sound for the music.
 - b) Battalions will conduct formation and begin movement to Summerall Field at 1715.
 - 2) Phase II, chow will be served and the DJ will be playing.
 - 3) Phase III, the Summerall Guards will conduct a performance at 1815 followed by a Regimental Band and cheerleader performance that serves as an introduction to the arrival of the football team.
 - a) Selected players and coaches will address the pep rally. The band and cheerleaders will do another performance to close out this phase. During

Phase IV, the DJ will provide music. Corn-hole, Frisbees, and footballs will also be available.

- 4) Phase V, Cadets will move back to their barracks on their own, and ESP will begin and be conducted as scheduled.

D. Tasks to Subordinate Units

- 1) Commandant
 - a) Brief the President of the event.

- 2) Chief of Staff
 - a) Allocate a budget of \$1,000 and act as approval authority for funding requests.

- 3) Office of Cadet Activities.
 - a) Overall responsible for the event.
 - b) Coordinate for DJ, games, sound, and cheerleader support.
 - c) Coordinate for AD, coaches, and football team participation.
 - d) Supervise Cadet Activities and Supply cadet chain of command performance of their duties.
 - e) Coordinate for Brigadier and photography support.
 - f) Prepare a continuity book and AAR and submit to the Assistant Commandant for Leadership Programs.
 - g) Brief event at the department meeting.
 - h) Develop a detailed backward planning sequence and schedule IPRs with the Assistant Commandant for Leadership Programs.
 - i) Develop a budget of no more than \$1,000 and submit to the Assistant Commandant for Leadership Programs. Submit requests for expenditures to the Chief of Staff through the Assistant Commandant for Leadership Programs.
 - j) Coordinate with Aramark for support.

- 3) Assistant Commandant for Operations and Training.
 - a) Put event on training schedule.
 - b) Coordinate for the use of Summerall Field.
 - c) Advise Public Safety of the event.

- 4) Summerall Guards Commander/TAC Advisor
 - a) Provide Summerall Guard support.

- 5) Band Co TAC/Band Director
 - a) Provide Band support.

- 6) Regimental Commander
 - a) Encourage maximum participation
 - b) Develop a risk management plan and submit to the Assistant Commandant for Operations and Training for approval.
 - c) Develop and issue orders and instructions to the SCCC as required.
 - d) Provide necessary command and control for movement to Summerall Field.

- 7) Palmetto Battery Commander/TAC
 - a) Provide Cannon support.

E. Coordinating Instructions

- 1) **Uniform is ACUs, ACUs without blouse and cover, or Citadel PTs.**
- 2) Upper-class are allowed to have guests attend the pep rally, but after chow.
- 3) A rehearsal will be conducted at the bleachers on Summerall Field at 1145 on 6 Oct. The following are required to attend:

- 4) A separate rehearsal with the Band Director will be conducted 28 Sept. at 1400 on Summerall Field.

4. Sustainment.

- A. Class I. There will be no supper meal in the mess hall. Aramark and Cadet Supply will set up sufficient serving lines on Summerall Field to feed 2,315 cadets. The menu will be hamburgers, hotdogs, chips and cookies. One serving line will remain operational until 1900 for late comers.


5. Command and Control.

| 1730 | Meal served by Aramark in front of PT Barracks from 1730-1815. (Reg. Band and Summerall Guards should eat first). DJ plays music during this time until 1800. |
| 1839 | DJ plays after retreat and cadets continue to socialize. |
| 1839-1845 | Summerall Guards perform on parade deck, in front of PT Barracks |
| 1845-1900 | Citadel Band performs along with The Citadel cheerleaders |
| 1900 | Entrance of Football team and coaches (cannon goes off, reg. band plays for their entrance right after cannon goes off) |
| 1905 - 1920 | Coaches & team captains to speak |
| 1920 - 1935 | DJ music plays. Games are played |
| 1940 | cadets move back to battalions for ESP |
| 1950 | ESP begins |
