Subj: COVID-19 Guidance to the SCCC Fall 21 #2

Cadets: The recent surge of the Delta has necessitated the need for us to protect the vulnerable.

Effective 0530 Wednesday 25 Aug ALL are required to wear Masks inside the following locations on Campus:

- All Academic buildings and Classrooms
- Mark Clark Hall
- Summerall Chapel
- Daniel Library
- Infirmary
- Counseling Center

Masks are not required outdoors, in barracks, Coward Hall or in any facility not described above.

In other situations indoors/outdoors. As men and women of character, be courteous to others who are wearing a mask. If you engage in conversation with someone wearing a mask or enter a room where someone is wearing a mask, be courteous and put a mask on as a sign of respect.

These temporary measures and an increase in campus-wide vaccination rates will help the college achieve the objective of normal operations. The Citadel has set a goal of 85% immunity campus-wide to ensure we can conduct normal operations.

Those who are vaccinated and have not updated their status are asked to report your vaccination status via an e-form [here](#). This information will remain confidential and will only be shared with college officials who have a legitimate need to fulfill their professional responsibilities for The Citadel, such as contact-tracing.

Barracks Room Visitation. Cadets are still authorized to visit rooms, but the following limitations are now in place:

- 2-person room: No more than 4 personnel at any time.
- 4-person room: No more than 6 personnel at any time.

How can you help?

- Wear a mask as directed above.
- If not vaccinated, get a vaccine. CPs can be granted by your TAC to get a vaccine.
- Be prudent about social distancing—when space is available use it.
